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NEEDS ANALYSIS

Complete a full needs analysis to evaluate gaps in within your curriculum.

- *Could be current simulations that are evaluated poorly by students that need to be reimaged.*
- *Could be lack of education that is missing before students get to the bedside.*
- *Could be a recent experience that students request additional training on.*



Write Objectives based
on Needs Analysis



Make sure objectives reflect

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SUBJECT MATTER EXPERT

Have a subject matter expert write your simulations. The benefits include but not limited to

- *Reduce bias and accurately represents patient population*
- *Simulation is true to clinical experience*
- *Allows fresh eyes to look at the simulation to catch any error.*



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COLLABORATE ON THE PATIENT

Subject matter expert (SME) and standardized patient (SP) educator will collaborate on the patient. We call this a "Character Description". The subject matter expert will assist to ensure the patient is accurate and does not further stereotypes. The SP educator will contribute to add an in-depth background with many details to make the simulation more accurate.

(If you don't have an SP educator simulation faculty should collaborate with SME)

HAVE EQUIPMENT ONSITE

Have Avkin Equipment onsite to become familiar with the products. Watch Out of the box and SP training video.

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COMPLETE DRY RUN OR PILOT

All stakeholders must be present to watch simulation take place.



Pro Tips!

Dry Run should be completed in the same room that the simulation is scheduled for .

Standardized patient should not see each other before the simulation starts .

Schedule dry run before the semester starts and everyone starts to get busy.

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FINAL DRAFT

Impliment all notes from the dry run.

Have standardized patient representative change anything on the character description after the dry run.

Have simulation representative make any changes to simulation flow or objectives.



Pro Tip!

After final approval from all stake holders save it as pdf so no accidental edits are made.



STANDARDIZED PATIENT DRESS REHEARSAL

Dress rehearsals are only for participating standardized patients. They are to ensure standardization and quality before simulation.



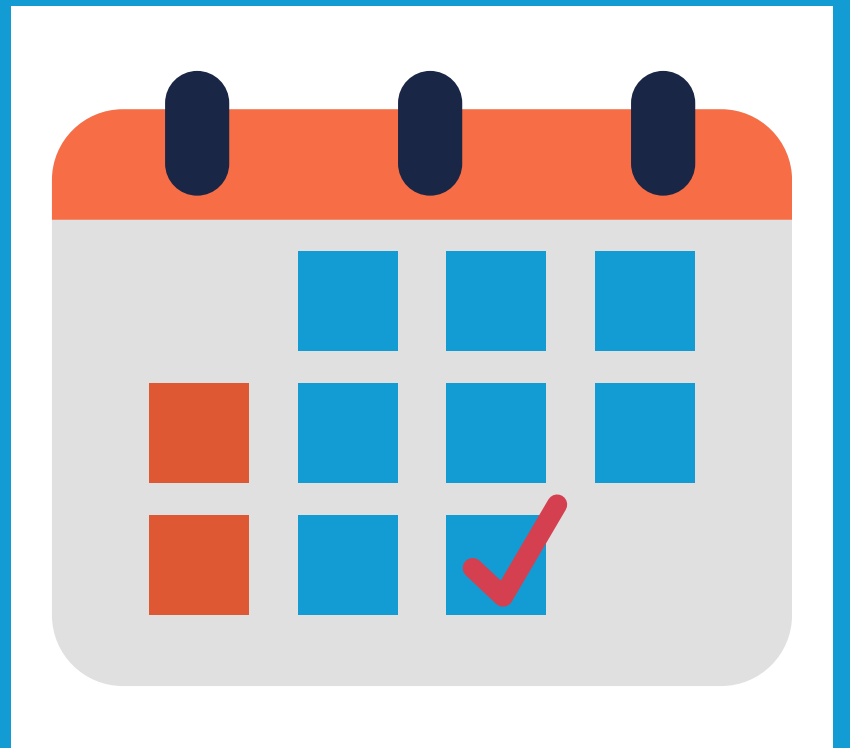
1 Ensure SPs receive character description 1-2 weeks before the dress rehearsal.



2 All SPs should be present to emphasize team standardization.



3 All SPs should PRACTICE playing the role of the patient! No exceptions!



4 All SPs should confirm their hours to ensure they will be there the day of simulation.
